Parents Legal Centre materials

The **Parents Legal Centre (PLC)** focuses on helping parents resolve their child protection matters early and collaboratively. It offers a lawyer and advocate to help at any stage of the child protection matter, from the first contact with the Ministry of Children and Family Development (MCFD) or a delegated Aboriginal agency until it's apparent the matter can't be resolved through collaborative processes.

The first PLC opened in 2015 in Vancouver. There are now **ten** locations to serve communities across BC.
